

to West Lindsey's 2025 Churches Festival – a celebration of rich architecture and heritage, of beautiful tranquillity and spirituality, and a welcoming oasis of peace that all our churches offer.

This year 100 churches are participating over the two weekends and we are also pleased to include a few neighbouring churches across the border in North Lincolnshire.


The first weekend takes place in the west of the area and what a treat our churches have in store for you. Tower tours at St Andrew's, Kirton in Lindsey, a family friendly 'mouse hunt' at St Genewys, Scotton, and Viking Graffiti at the cruciform Anglo-Saxon Minster church of St Mary at Stow.

Travel across the border to Epworth, birthplace of Methodism and visit the Wesley Memorial Methodist Church, built as a lasting memorial to John Wesley, considered the father of Methodism and his brother Charles, composer of over 6,500 hymns.

Highlights during week two include 'Value it, Flog it' at St Edmund's, Riby, where you can receive expert advice on your treasured items. St Peter and St Paul, Middle Rasen enjoy 'Holiday Memories', Holy Rood, Market Rasen celebrate 'angels' and St John the Baptist, Nettleton depict the 'Colours of The Rainbow' through vibrant floral decorations.

Our churches showcase our communities' histories through the ages. As well as delightful 14th-15th century pew ends, Ulceby, St Nicholas has a rood screen linked to nearby Thornton Abbey. Hainton, St Mary's, remembers the Heneage Family through its collection of nationally important monuments, spanning five centuries from brass memorials of 1435 to modern day memorials of 1954. And 11th century Glentworth, St Michael shares its links to the Mayflower Pilgrims that sailed to American from Boston.

All Saints, Tealby displays information of the village links with Victorian poet Alfred Lord Tennyson.

Finally, Scampton, St John the Baptist proudly recognises its close association with the RAF, with windows dedicated to personnel from RAF Scampton and 617 Squadron and interactive screens exploring the lives of people buried in the miliary and war graves in the churchyard.

Some churches open for you to take time out from the busy pace of life. The small wooden St John the Divine, Southrey invites just that, whilst also serving strawberries and cream! And there are plenty of other churches offering tempting cakes and refreshments. Just look for the symbol in the guide.

We hope you enjoy our festival and that you tell your friends about your experiences here in West Lindsey. We know many of you visit year after year and we thank you for your support in making this one of the biggest and best Churches Festivals in Europe. Not only are you supporting our church heritage, you are also supporting many of our small villages.





Glossary of terms

AISLE

In a church the aisles are generally the areas to the north and south of the nave, separated from it by an arcade.

ALTAR

The table located in the east end of the church at which Holy Communion (the eating of bread and drinking of wine in accordance with the instructions of Jesus at the Last Supper) is celebrated.

ANGLO-SAXON

(7th century to 1066) Saxon architecture is characterised by thick walls, with very thin, rounded windows, and masonry arranged at corners in an alternating 'long-short' pattern.

ARCADE

A series of connected arches.

AUMBREY

Small cupboard in a church wall, historically used for storing items used in communion.

BOX PEW

A pew with high sides of equal height entered by a door, typical of the 18th century.

CAPITAL

The carved head of a pillar or column.

CHANCEL

The east end of the church containing the altar.

CLERESTORY

An upper storey composed only of windows.

CUPOLA

A small dome forming a roof or ceiling.

DECORATED GOTHIC ARCHITECTURE

(c1250-c1350) Decorated Gothic is the second phase of English Gothic architecture. As the name suggests it is richly and elaborately embellished with carvings and, originally, paintwork. Characteristic features include complex curving and geometric tracery to windows, and the use of an 'ogee' arch (an arch which curves inwards and then outwards).

EARLY ENGLISH GOTHIC ARCHITECTURE

The first phase of Gothic architecture in this country is known as Early English. Buildings from throughout the period c1170-c1250 often fall within this stylistic framework. It is typified by 'lancet' windows (tall, narrow, single-opening windows which come to a single point with no internal divisions), pointed arches, stiff-leaf capitals, and ribbed vaulting.

FONT

Often in the form of a basin mounted on a pedestal; used for the baptism of children and adults.

GEORGIAN

The period 1714-1837, which includes the reign of William IV (1830-1837).

GOTHIC

Art and architecture of the mid to late medieval period (12th to 16th centuries). Gothic architecture appeared first in France in the 1140s. It is traditionally characterised by pointed arches. These arches distribute weight more efficiently, allowing taller, lighter and more spacious buildings.

GOTHIC REVIVAL

A style of architecture and design, beginning around the middle of the eighteenth century and attaining enormous popularity in the 19th century, that emulates the 'pointed' architecture of the 12th to 16th centuries.

HATCHMENT

Large, diagonal plaque with a deceased person's heraldic arms, carried at the funeral and then hung in the church.

Glossary of terms

MEDIEVAL

The period of European history between the fall of the Roman Empire and the Renaissance (5th to 16th centuries).

NAVE

The main body of the church, usually from the West door to the chancel, excluding any aisles. The nave belongs to the people and comes from the Latin term 'naves' meaning boat, reflecting the ark of Noah which protected God's people.

NEO-CLASSICAL

Art and architecture which emulates the styles of Ancient Greece and Rome, most prevalent in English churches in the 17th to 19th centuries.

NORMAN ARCHITECTURE

The Romanesque architecture which arrived in England with the Norman Conquest (1066 to the late 12th/early 13th centuries).

PASCHAL

Relating to Easter.

PERPENDICULAR GOTHIC

(c1340-16th century) During the late 14th century, English gothic architecture became more vertical and linear. The term 'Perpendicular' highlights the use of rectangular panels rather than the flowing tracery of the Decorated period. Most Perpendicular architecture can be identified by repetitive thin vertical panels used in windows, masonry, and in the striking 'fan vaulting' developed at this time.

PIETA

A picture or sculpture of the Virgin Mary holding the dead body of Christ on her lap or in her arms.

PISCINA

A basin set within the wall near to an altar, used in medieval services to wash the utensils of the mass and the hands of the priest.

POPPYHEAD

Carved ornament of leaves, often fleur-de-lys, on pew ends.

PULPIT

An enclosed platform from which sermons may be preached. These gained in popularity and significance following the Reformation.

REREDOS

A painted or sculpted screen covering the wall behind and above an altar.

ROMANESQUE

The architecture of the late 10th to late 12th centuries. Though emulating the Christian architecture of Rome it is not a 'Classical' style. Typical features include rounded arches and thick-wall construction.

ROOD SCREEN

An open-work screen separating the nave from the chancel and supporting a large cross (called a 'Rood' by the Anglo-Saxons).

SEDILIA

Seating set within the wall near to an altar for use by ministers during mass, often elaborately carved.

TRACERY

The web of stonework found in a window.

TRANSEPT

In cruciform (cross-shaped) churches, transepts are the areas that extend to the north and south immediately before the chancel.

TUDOR

From 1485-1603.

VICTORIAN

The period from 1837-1901.

1 Bishop Norton • St Peter






CHURCH DETAILS

Grade II* listed St Peter's sits in the heart of the village. It has three bells and a delightful stained glass East Window. There is a medieval tympanium in the tower wall, an ancient sarcophagus, a Joyce of Whitchurch clock and a 150 year old Nicholson organ. The lychgate is our War Memorial, Our theme is 'Well Known Authors'.

CHURCH DETAILS

Blyton church has an impressive display of the flags of the allies in WWI. They hang above arcades 6 and 7 centuries old. The chancel, although much rebuilt last century, has its original East window of about 1300, its old piscina and aumbry and a 15th century window and part of the old rood beam is still over the arch. The font, with carved panels and embattled top, is a handsome example of 15th century craftsmanship.


CHURCH DETAILS

Mentioned in the Domesday Book, the breathtaking Grade I listed Early English style building largely dates from the 13th century with a later 14th century tower which houses a ring of six bells dating from 1710 to 2002 and rung regularly. A warm welcome awaits those who come to quietly experience the incredible craftsmanship of our ancestors with some fascinating features. Enjoy light refreshments which will be available 2pm-4.30pm both days. Well behaved dogs welcome.

4 Brattleby • St Cuthbert





CHURCH DETAILS

St Cuthbert's sits in peaceful and secluded wooded grounds on the southern edge of the village. The lower section of the tower dates to the 11th century. The bells are some of the oldest in the county, installed in 1450. The churchyard contains the base of a listed Saxon cross, pre-dating the church and the thought provoking grave of WWII pilot Clare Connor (full story in church). the Saxon inner arch and the 14th century chancel arches show evidence of wall paintings. Visitors are assured of a warm welcome, with drinks and light refreshments being served, donations accepted.

CHURCH DETAILS

St Mary's church can safely be dated from 1066, although the tower is possibly earlier, giving evidence that there has been a centre of Christian worship in Broughton for over 900 years at least.

There are many interesting features in St Mary's including architecture from various periods in its history, Lindsey type grave slabs, and monuments to the Redford and Anderson families.








7 Coates by Stow • St Edith

The glory of St Edith's is its medieval woodwork. Magnificent rood screen with its loft and oak boarded tympanum dominates the church. It is the only surviving example in Lincolnshire. Please come and see our wonderful church mice.

CHURCH DETAILS

There has been a church on this site well over 1,000 years older than the British monarchy. It is 140 years since Bodley & Garner spread gold dust and beautified this Grade I church paid for by Mary Beckett. The parish registers will be made available. Come and see the stone coffin found under the altar in 1883/84. We shall have a churchyard tour weather permitting. The refreshments and lunches are Michelin star quality! A warm welcome awaits you.

CHURCH DETAILS

St Andrew's is Grade I listed, parts of which date back to the 12th century. It is best known for Samuel Wesley, rector from 1695 to 1735. His sons John and Charles were born and brought up in Epworth. Epworth is therefore seen as the birthplace of Methodism. Samuel is buried in the churchyard. We will be holding an exhibition and serving refreshments. There are various architectural features in the church, the north and south aisles are the earliest surviving.


CHURCH DETAILS

Built as a lasting memorial to John and Charles Wesley - opened on 15 September 1889. Visitors can see the famous stained glass window and the communion table which once stood in St Andrew's church and was used by Samuel Wesley to celebrate communion.


CHURCH DETAILS

A very different Georgian-style church with medieval tower and magnificent interior, with a copy of Da Vinci's The Last Supper behind the altar. The organ is a three-manual Walker (1906). See also the beautiful stained glass, late 17th century marble font and memorial headstone of Richard Rollett, master sailmaker to Captain James Cook on HMS The Resolution, who died two hundred years ago in 1824. Guided visits into the Bell Tower.

CHURCH DETAILS

Built in 1866 and situated in Cross Street, which is small and narrow, the church is set back from the road. The church is only a five-minute walk from Marshall's Yard retail centre. North Street and Roseway car parks are also nearby. The church's Indian Syro-Malabar community are lending sari dresses for a display. There is also information about the WWI memorial. Refreshments will include tea, coffee and cake.

CHURCH DETAILS

The church was built in 1897 as a memorial to John Robinson, pastor of the Mayflower Pilgrims. We hold a permanent Pilgrim exhibition in our Mayflower Room. The two manual pipe organ built in 1903 by Forster and Andrews is listed by the British Institute of Organ Studies as an instrument of national heritage importance.


CHURCH DETAILS

St Helen's church, Gate Burton is a beautiful estate church of 1866 by Sir G. G. Scott, with a west tower, nave and chancel. It has geometrical tracery. The font is Norman and drum shaped, and decorated with segmental arched arcading, revealing flowers or faces. Coffees and light snacks will be served in the church on the open weekend. While the road is marked private, access to the church is permitted.


CHURCH DETAILS


CHURCH DETAILS

St Michael's church is a superb late 11th century church with a stained glass window by Charles Kempe in the Saxon tower. It has a fine marble tomb of Sir Christopher Wray, Chief Justice of England during Elizabeth I's reign, with his wife and children and is an Elizabethan gem. Three of his children played leading roles in the spread of puritan ideas between 1600 and 1620 and were associated with the Mayflower Pilgrims that sailed to America from Boston.

Our new extension on the south side of the church is now finished disabled toilet, servery and meeting room. Also a disabled entrance through the new extension. Historical records from the Lincolnshire Archives as well as many other fascinating pieces of information about our church and its people. 
CHURCH DETAILS

The medieval settlement of Greetwell was established before the 11th century with 20-30 households. Up to the 15th century it was self sufficient in grain and had a dairy, a smithy, bakery, church and priest. Today, Greetwell flourishes with no village but a congregation from far and wide. Greetwell is one mile east of Lincoln on the road to Cherry Willingham.

CHURCH DETAILS

A warm welcome awaits you at this beautiful Victorian Gothic church with fine carved woodwork situated in peaceful surrounding among trees and parkland of Hackthorn Hall, overlooking the lake. There is an outstanding 1869 Nicholson organ of historic importance, restored in 1999. A peal of six bells was installed in 2006. Tea, coffee, cold drinks and biscuits.

CHURCH DETAILS

On entry to the church path, very visible on the original tower is a keyhole window. Set in a picturesque setting, this delightful church has the remains of a Saxon cross very close to the south facing door as well as having features of Norman arches. Another very interesting feature are the two upside down faces carved out on one of the pillars. There is graffiti dating between 11th and 13th century as well as other interesting features. We look forward to welcoming you to our beautiful church which stands proudly in the village surrounded by a well kept graveyard. Interested in local history? On display will be scrapbooks documenting village life in times gone by. Hemswell censuses and a graveyard plan will assist you in finding your ancestors. Light refreshments available both days. 23 Hibaldstow • St Hybald





CHURCH DETAILS

We are one of only 3 churches in the country dedicated to St Hybald - the other two being our sister church in Scawby and Ashby-de-la-Launde. And we have the particular honour of having the bones of St Hybald himself buried under our chancel. The village name Hibaldstow means 'burial-place of St Hybald' and dates back to at least 664AD. It is thought the St Hybald, possibly a pupil of St Chad, set up a mission station or monastery in what became Hibaldstow, and was eventually buried there. Despite the long history of Christian worship, the present church dates from 1866 (chancel) and 1875 (nave), and the tower was rebuilt in the 1960s. St Hybald's occasionally plays host to pilgrimages from to see the relics of St Hybald.


CHURCH DETAILS
