#### 1. Apologies were received from Cllrs Bunney, Firth and Widdison

#### 2. Normanby by Spital Parish Council Chairs Report

Cllr Elliot delivered the chairs report on behalf of Cllr Widdison. Thanks were given to Cllr Creek for his contribution to the council prior to his recent resignation. The clerk was thanked for her support over the year.

#### 3. Owmy by Spital Parish Council Chairs Report

Thanks were given to his fellow councillors, Cllr Crompton Howe gave an overview of what takes place at the meetings and how the precept is calculated and spent.

The Parish Clerk was acknowledged and thanked for her work throughout the year.

Cllr Bunney was thanked for the support he had given the council.

The pub and shop owners were thanked for their services to the village.

#### 4. Presentation "The Signpost"

The Parish Magazine is currently in danger of becoming Digital only. Cllr Elliott explained the ongoing costs and put forward suggestions to be voted on.

In order for it to continue in its current form there needs to be agreement reached between the 5 parishes it is delivered to.

Suggestions were –

- For each council to donate £350 per annum which would be reflected in the precept.
- To introduce a Normanby and Owmy Newsletter
- To do nothing.

The results from the meeting were that the majority felt an increase in the precept to donate would be acceptable.

#### 5. Community Park – The clerk delivered a report on the community park and what has been achieved over the last year with regards to grant funding.

#### 6. Reports from Local Organisations

- a. There were no representatives from local businesses or organisations.
- b. Liz Harris provided a report of activities in the surrounding area.

**7. Any other matters of Local interest**

A question was asked about when the Pipe line work was due to conclude. – The clerk indicated that Pipelaying is expected to be completed by autumn 2026, with reinstatement finished by early 2027. Tree and hedgerow planting will continue through to late 2027, supported by a five-year aftercare programme. With no further matters the meeting closed at 20:08 and attendees were encouraged to stay for coffee and cake.

8. Attendees were then encouraged to mingle, have tea\coffee and cake and to view the displays at the back of the hall showing plans for the community park and also examples of wildlife seen in the area.
